Frequently Asked Questions



HOW do I set out recycling for pickup?

Place recycling, garbage, and yard waste 10 ft. apart from each other at the curb.

WHAT if my bin is full?

Use another plastic container, cardboard box or garbage can, being sure these items are next to your recycling bin.

HOW should items be put in the bin?

Place lighter weight items on the bottom and heavier items on top to prevent litter.

WHEN is recycling collected?

Recycling is collected every other week. Go to www.republicservices.com/site/flint for a calendar of dates.

WHAT can I do with latex paint?

Unopened cans - Take to Habitat for Humanity

Opened cans (in useable condition) - Give to friends, family members, churches, preschools or community/college theater groups

Last Resort - Dry the paint out by opening the can, and adding cat litter, sawdust or a paint hardener, available at home improvement stores. Once hardened, put the paint can in a bag and deposit in your garbage.

HOW can I dispose of hazardous waste, other than at the spring and fall collections?

Note: These collections are not provided by Republic Services.

- Food cans, lids and cookware
- Labels are OK
- Flatten to save space in your bin



Plastics



- Bottles/containers with # symbol on the bottom
- Small household plastics no larger than a laundry basket
- ♦ Lids are OK
- ♦ Labels are OK
- Flatten to save space in your bin
- NO plastic bags

Glass

- Food & beverage bottles and jars only
- Colored and clear
- Labels are OK

Paper Products

(unwaxed boxes only)



- Newspaper
- Office Paper
- Junk mail
- **♦** Envelopes
- Magazines
- Catalogs
- Paper bags

- Cardboard (flatten or cut in pieces)
- Paper board boxes (cereal, snack, soda, tissue boxes and rolls, etc.)
- Phone books
- Pizza boxes

What is not OK

Plastic bags



- Plastic CD Cases
- Styrofoam
- VHS/VCR tapes
- Electronic waste
- Medical or hazardous waste
- Food or yard waste
- Paint, pesticides, or oil
- Window panes or mirrors
- Ceramics or glass dishware
- Waxed paper, liners, or boxes
- Fabrics or clothing
