Each event in the series will focus on a different area of the law and the legal issues and questions that have arisen due to the Flint Water Crisis. A panel of lawyers that specialize in each area will be present to discuss updates and answer your questions specific to each topic. The topics are as follows:

March 16: Housing and Landlord/Tenant Issues

March 23: Custody and Family Law

March 30: Bankruptcy

Some examples of topics that may be addressed are:

- *Can I break my lease to avoid the water issues?*
- *Can I withhold my rent if my landlord refuses to install filters?*
- *Can a custody agreement be modified to remove a child from the affected areas?*
- *Should I file for bankruptcy due to an unpaid water bill?*
